Achievements & Arrow Pts.

When scouts who are working for their Wolf or Bear badge complete more than the required achievements, those **extra** achievements can be applied to arrow points.

Each elective can only be counted one time. The first 10 completed electives or extra achievements will earn the scout a gold arrow point. Each 10 after that will earn them a silver arrow point.



Red Pride Rings/Vests

Scouts can receive Pride Patches for participating in Pack activities.

Activities for which they can receive these are: Park Clean Up (twice each year), Fundraising (popcorn & wreath sales), Scouting for Food, Winter Fun Night (sledding), Pinewood Derby, Cake Bake, and the Late Night in April.

The Pride ring is to be worn with the Pack patch in the center. Earned patches are then placed around this patch. At the beginning of each year the scouts should receive a patch denoting their level Tiger, Wolf, Bear or Webelo. These should be attached first, and then the Pride patches they earn during that year are to be placed on after that. It creates a spiral effect around the center patch.
